

### **Learning with Edvance**



At their graduation ceremony on July 5th, 2023, we have a photo of our enthusiastic Edvance students. Our Health and Safety training program began in February of this year and has recently concluded with remarkable achievements. Our twelve participants gained invaluable knowledge regarding the Health & Safety At Work Act 2015. The program covered a range of topics, including proper PPE use, health & safety signage, workplace documents, and risk assessment. However, the most significant aspect of the program was the development of their online research skills. The group investigated local and relevant H&S case studies, including recent incidents such as the truck glue spill/fire in Manukau, the industrial scrap fire in Penrose, and the Loafer's Lodge fire. Through in-class discussions, the group became proficient in answering the Five W's (Who, What, Where, Why, and When) and referencing pertinent statistics related to current events. They can now provide a summary of what to expect from a health and safety investigation viewpoint based on these topical stories.

### **Martin's Message**





In December this year, Altus (in its various forms) will be 60 years old. We will be holding a celebration to mark the achievement. Altus is back and growing strongly following a very tough period during Covid shutdowns. We now employ over 150 people in our Papatoetoe facility and aim to keep growing. Demand for our services from customers like Air NZ and Marley is very strong.

I am Chairman of Aotearoa Disability Enterprises Inc (ADE). It is the national representative organisation for all Disability Enterprises in NZ. www.ade.org.nz ADE would like to expand and grow the coverage of DEs into regions around NZ that lack access to these organisations such as: Wellington, Hamilton, Tauranga etc. We think there is a demand for another 1000+ people to be employed in organisations like Altus. However, Government has consistently refused for many years to allow an increase in geographic coverage or the total numbers of employees.

ADE is also keen to engage with Ministers or MSD officials before the elections who are proposing to radically change the way existing ADE members are allowed to operate and how they pay their employees. Disability Enterprises like Altus receive minor funding today from MSD. To date there have been no real meetings or consultation on these long-standing Labour Party Policy proposals which could fundamentally adversely impact ADE members and affect their ability to operate and employ people. I suggest you ask your MP before voting to explain their policy on Disability Enterprises like Altus.

As Martin mentioned Altus Enterprises will be celebrating its 60th year Anniversary on Wednesday 6th December 2023.
